Glen Holland was a US citizen, born on 1 August 1918, who enlisted in the RCAF in Ottawa on 21 January 1941. He completed his flying training and was granted a commission in October 1941, subsequently being posted to the UK where he served with 605 Squadron during 1944. He and his navigator, Flg Off W.H. Wilkinson, failed to return from an intruder sortie to Rheine airfield, Germany, in Mosquito VI NS928 during the night of 20/21 April 1944. They were buried in the Reichwald Forest War Cemetery.
